Summer Assignment AP World History

PART I: *Each student in AP World History must arrive on the first day of class equipped with a one or one-and-a half-inch three-ring binder with loose-leaf paper. This will serve as his or her notebook for the entire school year. Students are not permitted to use a different type of notebook for this class. They are also not permitted to use this binder for any other class. One report card point is deducted for each and every day that a student reports to class without these items.*

PART II: *Read the textbook pages 396 - 419 and answer the questions below. Your answers can be hand-written on the lines provided, or you can delete the lines and type directly onto this sheet. On the first day of school you will take a quiz on the assigned reading that will count as 3% of your grade in marking period one. You will be permitted to have this assignment on your desk during the quiz. Once the quiz is completed, this assignment and the quiz itself will be turned in.*

1. From what country was Pieter Brueghel? With what European historical period is his art associated? How is his art best remembered?

2. What political and economic changes occurred in Europe between 1550 and 1750?

3. What cultural changes occurred in Europe during the same period?

4. What were indulgences? Why were they sold? Who was Martin Luther and why did he object to their sale?

5. What other theological objections did Luther have with Catholic Church doctrine?

6. Who was John Calvin? In what ways were his religious views similar or different than Calvin's?

7. What reforms did the Catholic Church undertake in response to the Protestant Reformation? Who are the Jesuits?

8. Who was King Philip II? What role did he play in the Counter-Reformation?

9. Who was King Henry of Navarre? What was the Edict of Nantes?

10. Who was Henry VIII? What role did he have in the Protestant Reformation?

11. What was the Scientific Revolution? Whose theories were challenged during this period? Who was Nicholas Copernicus? What was his theory and how did it contradict earlier ones?

12. Who were Tycho Brahe and Johannes Kepler? What findings did they add to Copernicus' theories?

13. What contribution did Galileo Galilei make to the heliocentric theory?

14. Who were Robert Boyle and Isaac Newton?

15. What was the Enlightenment?

16. To what does the term Bourgeoisie refer?

17. What factors contributed to Dutch prosperity in the 17th century?

18. What were joint-stock companies?

19. What was serfdom? Why did it begin to decline after 1500? What new crops were developed that helped the rural poor avoid starvation?

20. What was the status of women in Europe during the Renaissance? What exceptions to their general status existed? What factors led European couples to marry older?

21. What was the Holy Roman Empire? Who was Charles V?

22. Who were Charles I and Oliver Cromwell? Why did the English Civil War occur? What was the outcome?

23. Why were the Stuarts restored to the throne? What was the outcome of the Glorious Revolution?

24. What role did the Palace of Versailles play in the reign of Louis XIV?

25. Who was John Locke? What were his primary theories?

PART III: Read the book *The Agony and the Ecstasy* by Irving Stone. Prepare a typewritten outline of the entire book broken down by chapter. Your outline should include a plot summary as well as what you see as important terms and concepts. You do not need to use complete sentences at all time. On the second day of school, you will take a test on the book that will count as 10% of your grade in marking period one. You will be allowed to have this assignment on your desk during the test. Once the test is completed, both the test and this assignment will be turned in.
