

TKTS BOOTH

TKTS Ticket booths sell unsold tickets the day of the performance for 25% - 50% off the original price, plus a three-dollar service charge. For example, if a ticket for *Wicked* is \$95 and has not been sold, a TKTS booth might sell it the day of the performance for 50% off, \$47.50, plus another \$3, bringing the price to \$50.50 – still a huge discount. The main TKTS booth is located in Times Square "under the red steps" in Father Duffy Square on Broadway and 47th Street. For more TKTS locations visit www.tkts.com.

Subway lines A,C,E,N,Q,R,W,1,2,3 all stop on 42nd and Times Square.

GETTING TO THE THEATER...

Don't know where the theater is located? HOPSTOP.COM is a great tool. At the website you to enter your starting address and your destination. It will give you subway, bus, and/or walking directions from your door to the theater!

HUNGRY?

Since food and drink at the theater can be expensive, another option is to bring a small water bottle and snack in your bag. You cannot eat in the seats, but during intermission you can step outside and enjoy a snack from home.

COUPONS/DISCOUNT PROGRAMS

The Theater Development Fund, or **TDF**, sells discounted tickets to full-time students who become members for a yearly fee of \$27.50. The application is online at www.tdf.org.

Broadwaybox.com offers discount codes where tickets can be purchased for 20%-40% off. *The Little Mermaid*, for example, is normally \$121 and can be bought for \$69.
